Since when have the rules changed so much?

Many of us, who lived for quite a long time and have seen the creation of the 7 Commandments, have noticed that most of this rules have changed. We investigated and this is what we found about these changes.

The first change was made to the fourth commandment, which used to be "No animal shall sleep in a bed". After the pigs started sleeping in Jones's house, rumors came up that they were sleeping on beds. A memorable clash : The battle of Cowshed

On October 12, Mr. Jones and several other men arrived and attacked the farm, reportedly, this was foreseen by Snowball (a pig) who had already planned an attack after reading an old book of Julius Caesar's campaigns in the farmhouse. The fall of the windmill
